Assess Student Expectations Early in the Semester

Stating your expectations for student behavior early in the semester will help to orient students to the type of learning and classroom behaviors you expect from them throughout the entire semester, but it's not the only early-semester strategy that will help set your students up for success (Nilson, 2016). Assessing your students' expectations for the course is just as important, as it will help you determine whether you and your students are on the same page about the learning journey you're about to undertake together. You can opt to have an in-class discussion where you ask students to share their expectations, set up an online discussion forum, or you can choose to administer a survey (an example of such a survey appears below). No matter which method you choose, make sure to ask students specific questions about their expectations regarding learning activities, faculty-student interactions, participation, technology use, and assignment feedback. Once you've assessed what your students' expectations for the course are, you can involve students in a dialogue about how to bring your expectations into alignment and address any misconceptions students might have.
